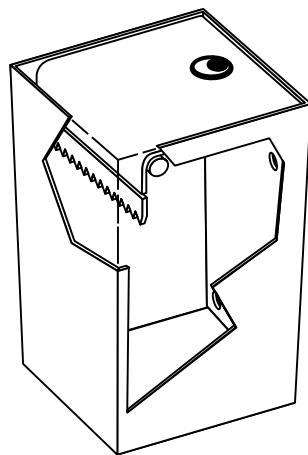
National Retailers are Using More Cash Drop Safes To Reduce Loss and Increase Security

Maintaining excess cash in a point of sale register invites both armed robbery and increased employee theft.

Based on this fact, more retail chains are turning to point-of-sale cash storage devices to reduce their front line risks.

A Safe Is Not Enough

Most businesses that handle any amount of cash recognize the need for a safe to store receipts between bank deposits. Typically, however, these safes are located in a manager's office. The problem arises during busy times when the manager fails to regularly strip the register.



The risk of loss increases directly with the cash buildup in the register. Even when there are specific guidelines, it is not uncommon to have more than \$300-\$400 build up in a register. The most efficient way to control this buildup of cash is to use a small cash drop safe mounted to the counter next to the register.

Inexpensive and Effective

These small drop boxes are not designed for overnight storage, but provide a location for employees to drop excess cash. Every \$20 and larger bill that comes in, can be dropped along with excess 5's and 10's. The
