Gimme a Set of Bolt Cutters and I'll Show You How to Open That Lock!

One of the easiest types of locks to break into is a padlock. They are a pain in the neck to pick open because the pins are so small, they are almost impossible to drill because you can't safely hold onto them without a special vice or jig, hand making a key for them usually costs more than the lock cost in the first place. Choose a Padlock and Hasp that Go Together
